

OMONIYI IBIETAN, PHD

Dr. Omoniyi Ibietan, 50, is a strategic communication and multistakeholder relationship management specialist. He originally trained as a journalist at the International Institute of Journalism, Abuja (the only campus of the International Institute of Journalism in sub-Saharan Africa), where he later taught journalism.

He was a specialised reporter of the water sector at the height of the water sector reforms in mid-gos covering the SouthWest of Nigeria for Waterlink, an independent publication of the Nigerian Water Supply Association. He later moved to generalised reporting beginning with a stint with PM News in Port Harcourt.

He obtained B.A. in Communication Arts from University of Uyo, M.A. in Communication and Language Arts from University of Ibadan, and a Ph.D in communication from North-West University, South Africa. As a student at the University of Ibadan, he also taught journalism and media sociology at The Polytechnic Ibadan.

In 2014, he was certified as a regulation specialist by the Washington-based Institute for Public Private Partnerships and the WEDC of Loughborough University in the UK. Earlier, he was a regional media researcher for Freedom House Nigeria (first sub-Saharan Africa project of Freedom House, oldest US-based NGO focused on press freedom and democracy). On the sideline of that work experience, he undertook a baseline study for the United Nations-mandated University for Peace (U-Peace) and 5 collaborated with U-Peace to implement a non-violent transformation of conflict workshop for youths in the Niger Delta in 2005.

Later that year, he was appointed Special Media Advisor to the Nigerian Minister of Information and National Orientation (later Information and Communication). At the expiration of his principal's (Hon. Frank Nweke Jr.) tenure, he had a stint with the Nigerian Communications Satellite Limited where he was Manager Media and External Relations and acting Head of Corporate Communications.

In 2008, he was employed by the Nigerian Communications Commission, first as a frontline legislative relations liaison manager with the National Assembly (Nigeria's federal bicameral legislature). At different times, he was Manager Media and PR, Senior Manager Media Management, and Head of Online Media and Special Publication at the Commission. He is currently a team lead for Consumer Information and Education at the Commission's Consumer Affairs Bureau.

As a social entrepreneur, he was part of the leadership of the Nigerian students' movement of the late 1980s and 1990s, and was intimately involved in the civil rights movement that coalesced to resist military dictatorships and ensured the return of democratic rule in Nigeria. Dr. Ibietan remains a volunteer to state and non-state actors on development issues, including the Nigeria Centre for Disease Control (NCDC). His post-doctoral research interests spans political communication, digital media, community radio, and democracy and development.

He is married and has children. He's considerably travelled, having been to all the states in Nigeria, many countries in Africa, a few countries in the Middle East and Asia, and he has visited the UK, US and Canada repeatedly. 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
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
